Teaching Statement

As a counselor, school counselor, supervisor, educator, and consultant my aim is to be a conduit for the provision of holistic mental health services for all people from a standpoint which considers perspectives of culture and social justice. In counseling, I utilize a relationally focused strengths-based approach which attends to culture, spirituality, communication, intentionality, and advocacy within a client's contexts. My goal is to assist the client through both modeling and helping the individual(s) with maintaining healthy relationships in which they can both thrive and serve others on multiple (individual [micro], community [meso], and public [macro] levels. As a licensed school counselor, my attention to empathy, disparities, service provision, advocacy and systems within the K-12 educational setting is guided by the ASCA Model.

My pedagogy is academically based on Gowin's concept of educating (1981) and utilizes the framework of social constructivists (Snowman, 2009) in conjunction with Gardner's (1999) seven multiple intelligences. The approach assumes the learning environment is compromised of a two-way relationship, respect for persons and a safe environment from which perspectives are to be explored, and incorporates application-based project learning to facilitate student development. My practice of supervision is founded within a cultural and social justice framework which also incorporates the Discrimination Model (Bernard & Goodyear, 1992) as a means to both grow and push all those involved to seek to understand and act out of informed intentionality. As a consultant (which includes advocacy, service, and research projects) my motto is "to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with my God" (Micah 6:8) for the betterment of all stakeholders.
