The Human and Organizational Leadership Development (HOLD) program prepares undergraduates to understand, lead, and work effectively with diverse stakeholders in wide variety of organizations. The curriculum provides students with a grounding in the science of learning, organizational and leadership theory, quantitative and qualitative social science research methods, and data-informed decisionmaking. Students gain insight into a broad range of organizations, including schools, businesses, nonprofits, and government agencies committed to cultivating clients' and workers' capacities. HOLD graduates will be skilled collaborators and communicators, keen observers of social structures and dynamics, as well as careful data consumers and analysts.

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#### A Multidisciplinary Program

The Human and Organizational Leadership Development (HOLD) program offers a program of study that builds upon scholarship in education, social science, policy, analytics, and leadership. The program mixes theory and practical skills that drive organizational improvement.
